

ORDINANCE NO: 0-2004-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BOVILL, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 270; EXPRESSING AN INTENT TO INCREASE WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION FEES; PROVIDING AMENDED WATER CONNECTION FEES; PROVIDING AMENDED SEWER CONNECTION FEES; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined it in the public interest to increase water and sewer connection fees:

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held before the City Council on July 12, 2004, and it was determined that raising said water and sewer connection fees would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOVILL AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. SECTION 6 of ORDINANCE NO. 270 be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

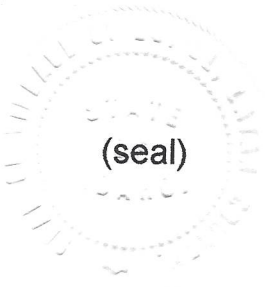
SECTION 6. WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION FEE

The connection fee for water services from the City Water system shall be \$1500.00. This money will be placed in a dedicated account for repair and capital improvements to the water system. Additional installation costs will be charged for meter and all other materials and labor at \$35.00 per hour. Faulty water meters will be replaced by the City maintenance personnel only; at no fee to the property owner unless meter is damaged due to neglect of the property owner or the plumbing. A fee of \$75.00 will be charged to the property owner for damage to meter due to property owner neglect or plumbing. This charge includes materials and labor. The meter remains the property of the City of Bovill. The connection fee for sewer services shall be \$1000.00.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. That this ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
